






\$7,518 AVERAGE ANNUAL DOMESTIC TUITION









INDIGENOUS GRADUATE STUDENTS

1.2%

of respondents identified as Indigenous.

These individuals have HALF the annual stipend value compared to non-Indigenous respondents.



UNDER-REPRESENTED COMMUNITIES

GRADUATE STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

10%

of respondents identified having a disability.

These individuals have **similar** government award status, stipend amounts and equally have a "struggling" or "tight" financial situation.
